

Responding to Tornados in Oklahoma - from Amy Gopp at Week of Compassion

Week of Compassion is responding to the tornados that struck the Oklahoma City metropolitan area a little over a week ago. Our staff has been in touch with the Oklahoma Regional Office, and is currently working with them to assess needs affecting Disciples and will as always, work with our churches and Disciples Volunteering to discern the best way to contribute to the long-term recovery of affected communities across Oklahoma City and beyond.

At this point, only skilled first-responders are permitted to enter affected areas. If you would like to help out, the best thing you can do is to **Pray**, **Pay**, **and Stay**: pray for those affected, contribute to immediate needs by writing a check for Week of Compassion in the offering plate and, and stay where you are. The time for volunteers will come, (as it did for Joplin, where we are headed June 16), but it is not today! We continue to keep Moore and all areas affected by disasters in our prayers. Thank you for all of the ways you partner with us and support those in need.

+ You may have noticed a beautiful young Newfoundland dog in worship on Sunday. Her name is Osa Bella, and she is Bette Klein's Service Dog in training. A Service Dog in training is considered a Service Dog by authorities and is treated the same way. Osa is becoming a PTSD dog to assist Bette with challenges of PTSD disability. Bette's plan is to thoroughly train Osa, and then to begin to train other dogs for use by





When approaching Bette, please always talk to Bette and ask if you may pet Osa, if you desire to pet her. Osa needs to be dismissed from work if she is going to interact with others. Otherwise, her attention needs to be directed towards Bette. Please do not allow children to poke, grab, or otherwise distract Osa. She is working. Please do not call to Osa from a distance away because this may cause her to temporarily lose focus on the service she is providing. Because she is a Service Dog, Osa is allowed

anywhere Bette goes with the exception being an operating room. So, Bette and Osa operate as a team. If you have an allergy to dogs, Bette would be happy to move her team to an area away from you so you do not suffer. It is okay to ask her to move the dog.

Bette is willing to discuss Service Dogs, training, and disabilities that Service Dogs can aid in mitigating. It is generally impolite to inquire about a disabled person's disabilities without a prior close personal relationship. We welcome Osa!

The Mission and Witness Department of First Christian is hosting the **May Family Night** at **The Spot**, where the program of the **Consultation of Religious Communities** called "**Family to Family**" holds a monthly meeting. The Family to Family program helps recently arrived families who have successfully adjusted to Iowa City, assist newer arrivals to make the same successful transition. The program supports, educates and builds community. **The Spot** is located at 1030 Crosspark Avenue in Iowa City in former warehouse space on the back side (south end) of the Pepperwood Plaza in the Broadway neighborhood – roughly speaking it is behind the Stuff, Etc, store and is best accessed off of Crosspark Avenue near the intersection with Broadway Street.

Volunteers are to **arrive by 5:45 p.m. Thursday, May 30**. We'll be serving pizzeria pizza and drinks and ice cream bars furnished by First Christian; programs will follow. If weather permits we will have outdoor games for younger children. Older children will shoot baskets in the gym. Activities may include chalk drawing, jumping rope, and a small drum circle, for instance. **Parent Partners** (a DHS program) will present a program at Family Night in May for parents of young children that will be divided into three mini workshops. There will also be a **discussion group** for teen girls and their parents about fighting and conflict resolution since things have been pretty tense recently and are likely to get hotter once school is out. - + **Pat Arnold's** employment as our HeadStart Preschool Director will end in June and she will be having a hysterectomy on June 11, so it will be a time of changes for her which we hope will prove to be liberating. Our prayers are welcomed.
- + Reminder: The I-80/Dubuque Street intersection is open except when turning north from the eastbound I-80 exit, so you may need to change your usual route to worship this weekend as you head to worship.
- + **Finances:** Our Annual Stewardship Campaign is now in progress. Letters were mailed last week to our members and friends and a copy has been attached to this newsletter for your easy access. **Sunday, June 2** is Commitment Sunday please return your completed Estimate of Giving card to the church office by or on June 2 so we can assemble a budget for the 2013-2014 program year. We'll be bringing our cards forward during worship on June 2 to present them; extra cards are always available in the gathering space to be filled out at any time.

On Sunday, May 5 our church board accepted an offer from Brian and Sabra Fleck to buy our North Lot at the price of \$120,000. After paying fees and applying the proceeds to our mortgage, we will have reduced the remaining balance of our mortgage to about \$100,000 (down from \$1.1 million in 2002). Our monthly principal & interest payments are about \$5000. Praise God for the blessings provided to our congregation.

As we look forward to creating a budget for the 2013-2014 fiscal year, we are faced with the loss of \$21,000 in income as HACAP closes the Headstart program which we have housed. We also will have used up the \$15,000 which was carried forward from previous years and the balance from the Sunier Elderly Fund, so we need to raise another \$30,000 just to compensate for loss of those income sources. Please prayerfully consider increasing the amount of your financial contributions to the work of the congregation.

+ An ad hoc group of our members with experience and expertise in child care is actively searching **out new** partners to use our facility for preschool/child care.

+ We are seeking a new **Director of Christian Formation** to work with our children and youth and their families after Bette Klein leaves our staff in June. A job description is on our website and the Personnel Committee (Nancy Richards, Nancy Ream, and Gayle Cuppy) and some of our child/youth leaders will refine the job description, seek candidates, and interview them. Advertisements have been placed in newspapers and online.

+ Scholarships - DUE BY JUNE 1, 2013

It is time to apply for scholarships awarded by First Christian Church for the 2013 fall semester. Scholarships are available from two funds within the church. Requirements are as follows:

- 1. **Helen Gay Scholarship:** First consideration shall be given to an applicant who is a participant (student or parent) of Coralville First Christian Church and who is pursuing higher education in the medical field.
- 2. **Sunier Scholarship:** First consideration shall be given to an applicant who is a participant (student or parent) of Coralville First Christian Church. Applicant must enroll for at least two semester hours of credit in English Language literature or poetry as a full time student (required rhetoric or freshman English composition classes will not be considered.)

Please note that the Helen Gay Scholarship would be given first to someone in the medical field, but if there are no applicants meeting that requirement, it can be given to other applicants. The Sunier Scholarship is more limited and requires the applicant to be enrolled in a literature or poetry class, but there are a broad range of classes that would fall under that classification.

Applications are available in the church office and must be returned to the office by June 1, 2013. If you or someone in your family will be attending a college or university in the fall, please consider applying for one of these scholarships. Anyone interested should contact the church office for more information.

After bringing the kids downstairs as usual for singing, a lesson, and a prayer, we'd like to try bringing them BACK upstairs for Communion with the rest of the congregation. Children will re-join their families in their respective pews and we will all enjoy Communion and close the worship service as a church family. Stewardship or Fundraising?

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ

May 9, 2013

As we celebrate the 150th Anniversary of our congregation, we recall our homes at Higbee Grove in rural Johnson County, on Iowa Avenue in Iowa City and now ten years on Lincolnshire Place in Coralville. It is good to take a look back at our rich history and the many varied missions and ministries in which First Christian Church has been involved. We should be enthusiastic about our past. However, it has been said that "the past should serve as a reference point and not a dwelling place." This is the time of year when the leadership of the congregation looks forward and asks each one of us to answer the question, "How do I help the church to accomplish its mission and calling?" I am certain that in each era, significant financial challenges have presented themselves; today is no different.

As we look forward to creating a budget for the 2013-2014 fiscal year, we are faced with the loss of \$21,000 in income as HACAP closes the Headstart program which we have housed. We also will have used up the \$15,000 which was carried forward from previous years and the balance from the Sunier Elderly Fund, so we need to raise another \$30,000 just to compensate for loss of those income sources.

We have accepted an offer to sell the north lot to one of our neighbors and after paying fees and applying the proceeds to our mortgage; we will have reduced the remaining balance to around \$100,000. Our monthly principal & interest payments are about \$5000. We are growing close to once again being debt free. Praise God for the blessings provided to our congregation.

Sitting to write this, I (Gail) was reminded of a 2006 <u>DisciplesWorld</u> article by Rev. Lois Artis, then president of the Church Finance Council, titled "Do we practice stewardship or fundraising?" She states, "A generous steward understands each thing and each person in the world as a gift from God intended for the glory of God. A Christian steward gives because he loves and cares for all of God's creation and understands his mission as freeing others to act in the same way."

To grow our programs & ministries and maintain our staff and facilities, we are projecting an expense budget that will require \$270,000 in pledges and giving in the coming year. We recognize that this financial campaign is certainly shallow when we understand that stewardship doesn't just happen in the spring but also in the summer, fall and winter but without each individual's participation in serving others through our common ministry, we fail to achieve our high calling as a congregation.

When we consider everything each of us has as a gift from God, then we understand that we are loved and blessed by God and feel the wonder and awe of the prosperity which God has given us, our families and friends. An estimate of giving/pledge form is on the reverse side and we encourage you to prayerfully consider your financial contribution for the coming year. Please bring it with you to worship on Commitment Sunday, **June 2**nd.
