# A Note From Your Pastor

Dear Friends,

While this is your January newsletter, it is coming out before Christmas, so let me start with a few reminders about the remainder of 2023.

Sunday is December 24. We will have two worship services. We will not have Faith Formation.

- In morning worship (10am) we will observe the 4th Sunday of Advent and the children will share their Christmas Program. A note about online worship: the online morning service has a sermon instead of the Christmas Program. But, if you are excited to see what the kids share, we will be recording it in onsite worship that day and posting it to YouTube later.
- Christmas Eve worship (onsite and online) will be at 7pm. This is the traditional Christmas Eve service where we hear the story of Jesus' birth, sing favorite carols, and end with candlelight and "Silent Night."

On Sunday, December 31 we will have Brunch & Worship. This is a tradition we started several years ago on the Sunday between Christmas and New Year's Day. We gather in Fellowship Hall and have a casual service along with a light brunch. The food is provided, you do not need to bring anything. Food will start being served at 9:30am; worship will begin at 10am. You are welcome to eat during worship if that works best for you remember, this is casual. Again, no Faith Formation on this Sunday.

However, you are invited to stay after worship on December 31 to help un-decorate the sanctuary. Lend a hand as we take down the trees and other decorations and prepare the sanctuary for the season after Epiphany.

Then the new year will be upon us! I know this is a busy time, but I hope you'll spend some time reading this newsletter (and keep it handy so you can consult it later). Here are some highlights:

- Faith Formation begins again on January 7. That day youth & adults will make a piece of artwork based on our Advent/Christmas theme. Then on January 14 they begin an exciting new series. Read more on page 4. As always, our children have Children Worship & Wonder.

### A NEW YEAR, A NEW YOU: EMBODY WELL-BEING

We long for a faith that engages all of who we are—mind, body, heart, and soul—and invites us to be present in our bodies and in the present moment. We remember the ways Jesus integrated his humanity and divinity to fulfill his radical ministry. Similarly, we too are invited to bring all of who we are to God, to live out the love that chooses to be embodied in us.

Over five weeks (January 14 - February 11), Faith Formation for Youth and Adults focuses on components of well-being: intention setting, mindfulness, movement, and meditation. All are welcome to one, two, or more sessions! Meet in the Fellowship Hall at 11:15 a.m.

- Intention: Join in a discussion about support of setting goals and exploring intentions to achieve them. (January 14)
- Movement: Anyone -- all levels of fitness, health, and age are invited for a Nia group movement session. Nia
  is a holistic movement and wellness practice addressing each aspect of your life body, mind, and soul.
  (January 21)
- Community: Stay after service for the first potluck of 2024. (January 28)

A PLACE FOR EVERY NE

- Mindfulness: Meet to learn techniques for greater awareness of your internal state and external surroundings. Discover how to observe your thoughts, emotions, and present-moment experiences without judgment or reaction. (February 4)
- Meditation: We will spend time refocusing our bodies, thoughts, and breathing to reach a higher state of relaxation. You will learn simple techniques to apply at home. (February 11)

Children age 5-5th grade will have Children Worship & Wonder and a nursery will be provided for younger kiddos.

#### PASTOR JILL'S 2024 SABBATICAL

We have exciting news about our beloved Pastor Jill. After completing seven dedicated years of service with our congregation, Pastor Jill will be taking a well-deserved sabbatical from August through October 2024. During the sabbatical she will be immersed in overall wellness to renew, reflect, and revitalize. Congratulations to Pastor Jill!

In anticipation of Jill's time away, we want to share with you some aspects of the whats, the whys, and the hows that pertain to pastor sabbaticals at First Christian Church. The sabbath is a central biblical concept we fully embrace. The word means "stop". It means to stop toiling and doing and producing and to experience life balance through rest and individual reflection and renewal.

In these modern times, a dedicated sabbatical during a career has become a lost practice. Instead, employers and stakeholders expect ongoing productivity and multi-tasking. A reflection of this expectation is that the term "sabbatical" is seldom used in academia. Rather than a sabbatical, a faculty member may be awarded a "developmental leave". The faculty member is released from some teaching responsibilities in exchange for producing projects, publications, grants, and creative works.

In contrast to academia, the Disciples of Christ General Commission on Ministry supports sabbaticals as necessary, personal time away from the ministry. The sabbatical process fosters healthy relationships between congregations and their pastors and brings a sense of mutual care. When pastors can step away from the intense pace of the ministry and engage in nurturing activities, the pastors are enriched spiritually, mentally, and physically. In turn, the sabbatical process invites the congregation to express its gifts of service and leadership.

Our Board, Finance Team, and Personnel Team have sabbatical policies and procedures in place. For example, the Finance Team plans years ahead of a pastor's sabbatical by setting aside funds to cover staffing needs. The Personnel Team and the Pastoral Support Teams work with congregation leaders to cover the pastor's responsibilities while they are on sabbatical.

As members of First Christian Church, let's actively support Pastors Jill, Kara and Laura and the entire church leadership. This will be a year of renewal and revitalization for all of us. You will hear more soon as detailed plans are set.




#### **REMEMBERING REV. BOB WELSH**

Rev. Bob Welsh was the pastor of First Christian Church (1965 to 1992). For the rest of his life he remained an active member of the church. Even those who never knew Bob as pastor came to know him quickly as he was often the first to greet visitors on Sunday mornings. During his ministry, Bob helped FCC become a leader in the community in ecumenism and in mission to those living with less. The annual winter coat distribution started with Bob's willingness to say "yes", he was a tireless advocate for affordable housing, he left his fingerprints on our congregation, community, state, and in many lives.

We will celebrate Bob's life with a service at 1pm on Saturday, **January 6** at FCC. Bob always believed in the importance of showing up to celebrate the lives of people who mattered to him. We hope you will come celebrate Bob that day.


