## A Note From Your Pastor

Dear Friends,

On Sunday we shared in a service where we walked through the Christian year together. Beginning with Advent and going through the Sundays after Pentecost (also known as Ordinary Time), we set the table with colors and symbols of each season, remembered their meaning and stories, and sang songs from each season. Yes, we sang a Christmas song, an Easter song, a Pentecost song, and one to represent each other season. We did this because this is one of those unusual years when Advent did not begin on the Sunday of Thanksgiving weekend. So, it seemed



a fitting time to take advantage of that "extra" Sunday and remind ourselves how the Church tells time.

Why does that matter? First, Advent is the beginning of the church year - so, since the year is about to start, it seemed good to remember its rhythm. Second, while we might notice the changes of the colors in the sanctuary, we often don't spend a lot of time remembering the significance of these seasons. So, we did that on Sunday. Finally, as we heard in the service, "The Christian year is not simply something for use by our church leaders. Rather the structure of the Christian year is an invitation to each of us. It is an invitation for us to not simply learn the stories of faith, but to allow them to become part of who we are and how we are."

Yes, pastors and other "church nerds" may love things like liturgical seasons and colors, but their purpose is much larger. They are an invitation to each of us to engage in the stories of our faith and to be transformed by them.

As we anticipate Advent on Sunday, let me share a word about our journey through Advent this year. Our theme is "How Does a Weary World Rejoice?" The reality is that there are so many things in our lives and in this world that can make us weary. But weariness doesn't have the only word. There is that line in "O Holy Night" that says, "A thrill of hope, the weary world rejoices..." It reminds us that often weariness and joy (or other seemingly conflicting feelings and experiences) can live together. So, we explore this idea through this theme and propose some tools that will help us rejoice even amidst our weariness. How does a weary world rejoice? This Advent we'll suggest these ways: we acknowledge our weariness, we find joy in connection, we allow ourselves to be amazed, we sing stories of hope, we make room, we root ourselves in ritual, we trust our belovedness.

In addition to worship, I hope you picked up or requested your Advent devotional packet. In it is a devotional booklet as well as other materials you can work with throughout Advent. You are also invited to join us for Advent conversations on Wednesday evenings **starting tonight** on Zoom at 7pm. In preparation for those conversations, you might go ahead and read that week's devotional booklet pages. But don't worry if you haven't had a chance - you can join us without any preparation at all.

There is more information on page 3 of this newsletter about what's going on at First Christian this season. I hope you'll choose to participate in things that feel meaningful to you. And I hope you'll let this first season of a new church year be a time of delight and connection for you.

You can help by: making a casserole (pans & recipes are available at the church), providing other food, or volunteering that day. To sign up to volunteer or provide other food items, please use this link.



## Advent & Christmas - A Time to Worship

On the First Sunday of Advent (December 3) we will acknowledge our weariness and find hope.

On the **Second Sunday of Advent** (December 10) we will *find joy and healing in connection* and find peace. We will put our peace doves on the tree today.

On the **Third Sunday of Advent** (December 17) we will *allow ourselves to be amazed* and find joy. Our ornaments will appear on the Tree of Memories today.

Join us for the **Longest Night service** at 7pm on Thursday, December 21. This night we acknowledge that this time of year is difficult for many. We will both honor this and move toward hope and healing. This service will be recorded and then posted later on our <u>YouTube channel</u>.

On the **Fourth Sunday of Advent** (December 24) we will *sing stories of hope* and find love as the children share their Christmas program in morning worship.

On Christmas Eve night we will gather at 7pm and make room for the gift of God-with-us. This service will culminate in communion and singing "Silent Night" as we circle around the sanctuary with candles.

We will gather for **Brunch & Worship in Fellowship Hall** on December 31 and *root ourselves in ritual*. We will **start the new year** by *trusting our belovedness* as we worship together on January 7.


