#### A Note from the Pastor

Friends,

First, we have a favor to ask. The next step as we wait for our new seating to arrive is to have the floors done. That means we need your help again. If you can, please plan to stay after worship on Sunday to help stack chairs and move other items out of the sanctuary. We know the truth that "many hands make light work" so we hope you can stay.

As I write, I am marveling at the fact that this is our July newsletter. That means one more month before I am on sabbatical. As I prepare for sabbatical, and as we explore the idea of sabbath in worship throughout the month of July, this particular prayer from Ted Loder's book Guerrillas of Grace captured my heart. It is titled, "Let Me Live Grace-fully" and it reads this way:

"Thank you, Lord, for this season of sun and slow motion, of games and porch sitting, of picnics and light green fireflies on heavy purple evenings; and praise for slight breezes. It's good, God, as the first long day of creation. Let this season be for me a time of gathering together the pieces into which my busyness has broken me. O God, enable me now to grow wise through reflection, peaceful through the song of the cricket, recreated through the laughter of play. Most of all, Lord, let me live easily and grace-fully for a spell, so that I may see other souls deeply, share in a silence unhurried, listen to the sound of sunlight and shadows, explore barefoot the land of forgotten dreams and shy hopes, and find the right words to tell another who I am."

There is little that describes the core purpose of sabbath and sabbatical better than this. I am particularly struck by the sentence, "Let this season be for me a time of gathering together the pieces into which my busyness has broken me." This is at the heart of how I intend to spend the three months I am away and I hope to bring the essence of this back with me. I hope there are elements of this you can embrace as well.

- Thanks to all those who helped with pew dismantling and removal. We are currently living in an "in between time" with our chairs from Fellowship Hall temporarily moved to the sanctuary. We just received word that our new seating has been delayed and should arrive this fall.

Sappatical Applates

Pastor Jill's Sabbatical will be here soon. It begins August 1 which is still a month away, but inevitably will come quickly. We want to share some more reminders and information as we prepare for it.

Jill will be gone during the months of August, September, and October. We ask that you respect her time away. She will not be responding to emails or worshipping with us. We will also see less of her family. In Jim's absence, we need people to step up to help with Facilities Team and running sound in worship. You'll see Teegan some as he has come on staff as one of our nursery attendants. Although Cameron will be moving to Ohio for college, he will continue to do our online worship video editing.

Meanwhile, we are being left in very caring and capable hands:

- Kara will remain full time and will be taking on many of Jill's responsibilities including most of the pastoral care and administrative functions, as well as about half the preaching.
- Laura will continue to be part time but will be working more hours as she also does some pastoral care, leads Bible Study, takes on a few administrative functions, and preaches two Sundays.
- Also preaching during sabbatical are: Liz Woodward (our Partner Regional Minister in the Upper Midwest), Marian Hart, and Kent Clark.
- Traci Massman will be coming on staff during sabbatical and be leading our children's ministries.
- Carol will be working some extra hours in the office to support our staff and will help you connect with the right person for whatever you need.
- Board Moderator, Sally Strah, will also be available to answer questions.

And remember, the staff does not do this ministry alone - you also, always, have an important role!
