

A Note from the Pastor

Friends, this summer, specifically during the time Pastor Jill has been on sabbatical, has been an adventure in learning for the staff, volunteers and congregation.

In early June I began to notice a quickly progressing lack of control over my hands. It soon affected my ability to write, to hold a glass, to play the piano and to do fine-motion activities. As a musician and an artist,I was worried. I was diagnosed with essential tremor.

Then in mid-August I had a surprise visit to the hospital. What I thought might be a severe stomach flu turned out to be pancreatitis, combined with an infection. Surprisingly, my tremors were gone upon my release.

I tell you all this because I want to highlight what staff and volunteers did during this time. Everyone I asked to help said yes. I actually didn't need to do much asking. You all (staff and congregation) stepped in and did what needed to be done, even when I didn't ask. Pastor Kara, along with the staff in the office, filled in for my regular duties without being asked, as well.

Fast forward a few weeks: Last week Carol had surgery and will be out for a couple of weeks and Kara and her family were sidelined with Covid, so we had to revisit how to do things. And now, this week, I have tested positive for Covid. As I was trying to figure out who would do my regular job, I came to realize that staff and volunteers were already on top of it – ready and willing to take on whatever needed to be done.

This has been a summer of ups and downs. An adventure in how we all are a part of the whole. I am grateful for all of you who do what needs to be done – either by saying "yes" or simply stepping up.

This is a congregation of doers. You all look around and recognize needs in our church community, in our wider community and in our world. I am constantly amazed and awed by the unselfish and unconditional care you give.

So this is my message this week – I am grateful for all of you. You make being a part of the clergy staff a joyful and humbling experience. Thank you. You bring the community of Christ ever closer in our working toward the kin-dom.
